Position Overview

Divas Who Win Freedom Center seeks a dynamic summer intern to help build **ALTERED EGO: Becoming Beyond Survival**, an immersive arts experience launching during National Recovery Month.

This internship centers on **community partnership development, creative coordination, and cultural organizing**—helping transform a bold concept into a community-powered public experience.

ALTERED EGO explores identity, survival, transformation, resilience, healing, and the futures we choose. Through visual art, fashion, storytelling, immersive installations, and collaborative creative expression, this experience will invite the community into conversations around recovery, identity, and reclamation.

The intern will play a critical role in helping establish the partnerships, systems, and collaborative infrastructure needed to bring this exhibit to life.

- Maintain exhibit planning timeline
 - Track milestones, deadlines, and deliverables
 - Coordinate communication between Divas staff and creative collaborators
 - Help organize planning meetings
 - Maintain project documentation
